Contact sports and Traumatic Brain Injury TBI is at epidemic levels. Optometrists and Comprehensive Eye Exams are a Primary entry point into the TBI Interprofessional Care System. The bumps, jolts or blows to the head is the primary cause of the potentially fatal disease Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy CTE. As a result, The National Football League (NFL) has implemented an NFL Head, Neck and Spine Committees Concussion Diagnosis and Management protocol. Optometrists need to be aware of this not only for professional athlete TBI assessment, but also to be able to properly assess, manage, advise and refer their patients for best care practices. Dr. Marc Bloomenstein is a 1990 graduate of the University of California at Los Angeles with a degree in Biology. He received his optometric degree from the New England College of Optometry in 1994. After graduation, Dr. Bloomenstein finished a residency in secondary ophthalmic care at the Barnet Dulaney Eye

Center in Phoenix, Arizona. He received his fellowship from the American Academy of Optometry in December 1998.

Currently, Dr. Bloomenstein is the Director of Optometric Services at the Schwartz Laser Eye Center in Scottsdale, Arizona and President of MRB Eye Consultants. Dr. Bloomenstein is on the editorial board of Primary Care of Optometry News, Review of Optometry, Optometry Times, Modern Optometry, Optometric Management and a frequent contributor to other various optometric journals. Dr. Bloomenstein served as the Chairman of the AOA Continuing Education Committee and served on the board of the Ocular Surface Society of Optometry (OSSO), as well as a founding member of the Optometric Cornea, Cataract, and Refractive Society (OCCRS). Dr. Bloomenstein has served as President of the Arizona Optometric Association, Legislation Chair and President of the Board of the Arizona Optometric Charitable Foundation. Dr. Bloomenstein has delivered over 1500 invited lectures worldwide and serves as a consultant to numerous industry-leading pharmaceutical, biomedical and information technology companies.

Andrew Morgenstern, OD, FAAO, FNAP

Andrew Morgenstern, OD FAAO FNAP is the Director and Methodologist of the American Optometric Association (AOA) Clinical Resources Group that develops the AOA Evidence Based Clinical Practice Guidelines. Additionally, he is a contract Optometric Subject



Matter Expert for the United States Department of Defense (DoD)/ Defense Health Agency (DHA) Research and Development (J9) Directorate-Vision Center of Excellence (VCE) located at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center. Dr. Morgenstern is a credentialed clinician at the Walter Reed National Military Medical Center Department of Surgery/Ophthalmology, Medical Evaluation Treatment Team and Optometry services.

Dr. Morgenstern is the Co-Founder and President of the International Keratoconus Academy of Eye Care Professionals (IKA), Past President of the Optometric Cornea, Cataract and Refractive Society (OCCRS), Past President of the Maryland Optometric Association, and Chief Medical Editor Emeritus of Advanced Ocular Care and Collaborative Eye. He is currently adjunct clinical faculty at the Uniformed Services University (US Military Medical School) and the Nova Southeastern University College of Optometry. Dr. Morgenstern has served as the Co-Chair of the Ophthalmologic Disease Management Clinical Sub-Committee for the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act (MACRA) Episode-Based Resource Use Measures and has been an invited lecturer at the United States National Academy of Sciences

Engineering and Medicine (NASEM).

He is a graduate of Boston University (B.S.), Nova Southeastern University College of Optometry (O.D., Clinical Honors) and completed his training at the Bascom Palmer Eye Institute (BPEI) at the University of Miami School of Medicine, Department of Ophthalmology. He is board certified by the American Board of Optometry, a Fellow of the American Academy of Optometry and a Distinguished Practitioner of the National Academies of Practice. Dr. Morgenstern has special clinical interest in corneal refractive surgery and refractive solutions; artificial intelligence and machine learning in telemedicine; corneal ectatic disease and treatment; acute eye injury and visual dysfunction associated with traumatic brain injury and diabetic eye disease.

In 2012, he pursued his dream to focus on glaucoma, advanced anterior segment surgery care and pathology, joining Vance Thompson Vision in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. He earned Fellowship in the American Academy of Optometry in 2013, is the Optometric Externship Director at Vance Thompson Vision, Associate Optometric Residency Director, and Adjunct Clinical Professor of the Illinois College of Optometry and Kentucky College of Optometry.

Dr. Schweitzer regularly lectures on glaucoma, anterior segment pathology, refractive surgical clinical care, and surgical management at state, regional, and national meetings. He is currently the Chief Medical Editor for Modern Optometry and has contributed book chapters, journal articles, and case studies in peer reviewed and non-peer reviewed journals including Review of Optometry, Optometry Times, Primary Care Optometry News, Optometric Management, The Journal of Cataract and Refractive Surgery, Clinical Ophthalmology, and The Journal of Glaucoma. He has research interests in minimally invasive glaucoma surgery and biomechanical properties of the cornea as it relates to glaucoma. Dr. Schweitzer is an advocate of an integrated eye care delivery model and is currently serving as President for the South Dakota Optometric Society.

WOA REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Things You Need To Know About Registering for WOA Convention:

- ♦ The deadline for early bird registration is August 19, 2022. The deadline for regular registration is September 14, 2022. No registrations are allowed after September 14 or on-site.
- All courses will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis.
- ♦ The registration form is printed on both sides; one side is "Full Registration," and the other is "Partial Registration." Please complete only one side of the form!
- There are two choices for registration:
 - 1. <u>Full Registration:</u> One fee, including your choice of meals and all education classes you would like to take. Please still select all courses and meals you will be attending.
 - 2. <u>Partial Registration</u>: You choose which classes and meals you want to attend, and each is priced separately.
- If you plan to attend all or most of Convention, Full Registration is the way to go. If you can only attend a day or two, your best option may be Partial Registration. If you do Partial Registration and the total is more than Full Registration, you may pay the Full Registration amount, even if you're not planning on taking all the courses just make sure to select which courses and meals you plan on attending.
- Incomplete forms will delay processing. Please make sure you have provided all necessary information, and type or print clearly on the form. Even if you opt for full registration, you are still required to check off the meals and classes you plan on attending.
- Payment must be included with your registration form.
- If you choose "Full Registration," you must check which courses and meals you plan on attending. You will only receive tickets for classes and meals that are marked.
